IFRE fees comprise of two separate fees. An application fee of \$299 USD (covers advertising, staff/office expenses, etc.) and a nominal weekly program fee (covers room/board, field support, etc). You will pay your fee directly to host families and projects. In this way, what you pay will go for you or people who deserve it (not for profit).

Almost all volunteers stay with host families. Living with a host family provides volunteers the opportunity to get unique insight and exposure to the local culture and the opportunity to enjoy home cooked meals. Costa Rican meals are offered three times a day.

Volunteers' qualifications

No special skills are required for participating for most IFRE programs other than being open-minded, passionate about serving humanity, physically fit and ready for the hardships of living in a developing country. Volunteers for health projects need to be a medical professional or studying to become one. Teachers in English teaching projects must be fluent in English. Volunteers with some knowledge of Spanish are preferred. In health project, volunteers must be either medically trained professionals (doctors or nurses) or currently on the process of being trained (medical students). You must produce proof of this.

Orientation

A 1- or 2-hour long orientation program is provided for volunteers. Some knowledge of local do's and don'ts will be shared. Knowledge on everything from politics to transportation will be passed along as well.

Daily Life of a volunteer

The day to day agenda of volunteers varies according to the project, season and location. Here is a typical schedule:

7AM - 8AM: Wake up, enjoy breakfast and get

ready for the project.

8AM - 10AM: Arrive in the project, discuss about

daily schedule with project coordinator

and other agendas.

10AM -12Noon: Work in the volunteer projects

alongside local staffs.

12Noon - 1PM: Launch break, relax, and rest.

1PM - 3PM: Work in volunteer project.

3PM - 4PM: Wrap up volunteer work for the day

and head home to either host family or

home base.

After 4PM: Your free time - use it to explore the

country, culture, or just simply rest and

relax.

Arriving

Volunteers fly in and out of Juan Santa Maria International Airport. Make sure to let IFRE know about your travel details. You will be picked up by an IFRE's representative and taken to the host family.



Visas

While tourist visas can be obtained upon arrival in Costa Rica, IFRE recommends its volunteers to get a visa in a Costa Rican embassy or consulate, as getting a visa on arrival is marked by chaos and a long line.

Safety

Nothing is more important at IFRE than the safety of its volunteers. Families, staffers and the status of destination countries have all been carefully considered and screened long before projects are decided upon. Four layers of safety are provided for our volunteers: the country coordinator, project staff, field staff and comprehensive insurance coverage.

Vaccinations

IFRE suggests its volunteers to look at the Costa Rica country guide from the Centers for Disease Control at www.cdc.gov. It is recommended that travelers to Costa Rica get vaccines for:

- Routine (Recommended if you are not up-to-date with routine shots such as, measles/mumps/rubella (MMR) vaccine, diphtheria/pertussis/tetanus (DPT) vaccine, poliovirus vaccine, etc.)
- Hepatitis A or immune globulin (IG)
- Hepatitis B
- Typhoid
- Rabies
- Recommended if you are not up-to-date with routine shots such as, measles/mumps/rubella (MMR) vaccine, diphtheria/pertussis/tetanus (DPT) vaccine, poliovirus vaccine, etc

Airfare
